### Agenda Items

I. Welcome/Good Things ~ Ms. Gee

## IV. Marauder for a Day ~ Ms. Wesbrock

Marauder for a Day will take place in February where area feeder school bring their 8<sup>th</sup> grade students to the campus and engage in many activities. Link Crew, which is a group of student leaders, will take the students on a tour of the school, be a part of a student panel for a question answer session and other activities. The Counseling Team will also engage students in fun activities to see what classes they may be interested in. It is a wonderful opportunity for our future students to get a taste of what our high school has to offer.

V. Course Catalog/Course Selection/YC Early College ~ Ms. Wesbrock

Our course catalog is reviewed and edited in November. It then is on the board agenda for approval in December. Course selection for our students will begin in the second semester. This is done during English classes. Course selection is a two-part process with students filling out an ECAP, Education Career Academic Plan and compiling information in the Naviance Program. The counseling team helps the students navigate the Naviance Program to see what their educational plan might be. Once students have discussed class options, the counseling team helps them select classes for the next school year. The Naviance Program can be accessed through the student's google suite. When course selection is completed for all students the master schedule can be activated.

The master schedule is the process of combining the number of students to the classes offered. All student schedules will be filled with their core classes first then elective class. In May student schedules are created and balancing out of classes begin. Student schedules become available in July right before school registration.

YC Early College has been a great success this year. We have a total of 28 students who are taking college class on the Yavapai College campus and earning college and high school credits. Many of these students will obtain or be close to obtaining their AS general studies degree by the end of this year.

The application process for next year YC Early College students will consist of a paper process, student panel, parent informational night and interview process with Stephanie Garcia whom is the counselor for the YC Early College students.

A lively discussion regarding AP and duel enrollment followed Ms. Wesbrock's presentation.

Diploma seals for Biliteracy will be added to all those students who qualify this year. We had several students take the CLEP Spanish test where 95% of those tested passed to earn college credit.
