

Anonymous Alerts

What is the

Anonymous Alerts app?

The Anonymous Alerts antibullying and safety app reporting system helps combat bullying and other negative activity in schools by empowering students to speak up. Social and peer pressure are some of the hardest obstacles for students to overcome.

The system allows for 1-way or 2-way anonymous encrypted communications between submitters (students, parents or community members) and district administration and/or school staff. Users of the system have the option to remain anonymous or reveal their identity when submitting a report.

To use this revolutionary new app, students, parents or other school personnel can simply visit the Mingus Union High School website and click on the "Anonymous Alerts" button or text link to submit a report

Mingus Union High School supplies student an activation code, making the app remarkably easy to use and students select which school the message should go to. In addition, informational posters explaining how to use the app will be displayed throughout schools and offices in the district.


We are so proud of our Marauders & want to share the amazing things they do!



Savannah Tobias has been selected to represent the United States in women's basketball at the 2024 United World Games, which will take place in Klagenfurt am Wörthersee, Austria. She was selected from among several hundred candidates to be on the 16U team of eight girls that will represent the U.S. The selection process involved representatives watching her play at different tournaments and requesting videos. They also checked her school grades, as they were seeking a candidate who excelled in both sports and schoolwork. Founded in 2005 by the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization, the United World Games is an Olympic style youth sports tournament of 800 teams from 40 countries competing in 16 sports over four days every June.

Jireth Valenzuela was invited to represent MUHS and the State of Arizona in the Congress of Future Medical Leaders. The Congress is an honors-only academic program that will be held in the University of Massachusetts, Boston, in June 2024. Attendees will receive college credits as an optional benefit for their attendance, and will meet Nobel Prize winners, Award-winning inventors, and scientists. During the Congress, attendees discuss and observe state-of the art diagnostic tools and will have the opportunity to view a surgery where they will be able to submit questions for the surgeon and get answers in real time during the procedure. After the close of the Congress, Jireth will be presented with the Congress of Future Medical Leaders Award of Excellence.






VACTE - The Valley Academy of Career & Technology Education would like to highlight our FIRE SCIENCE PROGRAM

The Fire Science class is a college-level course that is designed to prepare entry – level firefighters to successfully achieve Arizona Center for Fire Service Excellence Fire Fighter I & II, Hazmat Certifications. It will teach students to understand and manage the role and function of a firefighter as outlined in NFPA 1001 - Standard for Fire Fighter Professional Qualifications. This course is hazardous by its nature and includes high-risk functions such as the use of a Self-Contained Breathing Apparatus, Wildland training, power tool operations, ladder operations, roof ventilations skills, vehicle extrication, and live firefighting exercises. Students conduct hands-on activities which prepare them for mentally and physically challenging experiences.

The VACTE Firefighter Certification Academy will earn 18 Yavapai College credits. The students will use the IFSTA Essentials 7th edition textbook including fire department operations, Firefighting equipment, tools, and safety. There is an emphasis on the chemistry of fire, techniques and skills of a firefighter, and utilization of equipment and tools used in the fire service. This academic preparation is for Arizona Center for Fire Service Excellence Fire Fighter I & II certification, and all the Job Performance Requirements associated with it. The class will include physically demanding work and various skills courses that will allow you to be able to function on the fire ground.







VACTE currently employs 3 fire fighting instructors, Ed Loesche, Eric Ostler, and Jarrett Tarver.

Mr. Loesch is a retired Coast Guard Chief, served on the Gulf Strike Team, and served as a fire fighter for over 30 years. Eric Ostler is a current fire fighter from Copper Canyon Fire & Medical Department and Jarrett Tarver is a current firefighter for Sedona Fire Department.
