Community & District

Mingus Union High School is located in the Verde Valley of Yavapai County, Arizona, approximately 100 miles north of Phoenix. Mingus serves the communities of Cottonwood, Cornville, Clarkdale, Jerome and Rimrock. Mingus Union High School is the only school in the Mingus Union High School District #4 and has an enrollment of approximately 1200 students in grades 9-12. There is a steady flow of tourism in this area with many families working in the service industry. Median household income for this area is \$42,000.00 and 70% of students in the district qualify for free/reduced lunch.

Curriculum & Academics

Mingus Union High School is accredited by AdvancedED and Arizona State Board of Education. Mingus Union High School is a four-year, comprehensive secondary school offering Advanced Placement, Dual Enrollment, Career/Technical Education and college preparatory courses. Classes run year long and are organized into six 50 minute periods per day. Every Wednesday is Advisory for students focused on college/career and social/emotional learning. Wednesdays are early release for teacher PLCs. Half (.5) credits are awarded at the end of each 18 week term (semester). Mingus utilizes the Carnegie Unit System.

Advanced Placement Courses

The following AP courses are offered: Language & Composition, Psychology, Studio Art, US History, World History, Computer Science, Computer Principles, and Chemistry/Biology (rotating years)

Career and Technical Education

Mingus Union High School works in partnership with the Valley Academy for Career and Technology Education to offer courses within the following fields: Agriscience, Automotive Technology, Business Operations, Construction Technology, Culinary Arts, Digital Filmmaking, Drafting/Design Technology, Education Professions, Engineering, Fire Science, Health Services, HVAC, Nursing Services, Technical Theatre and Welding Technology.
